There are approx. 360 million smartphones in Africa as of January 2016 - it is expected that this will increase to 500 million devices by 2025.

Prohibitive data costs and quality mobile reception remains a major roadblock in reaching people with evangelism materials. Audio Bibles can be up to 1 Gigabyte in size.

Oppressive regimes actively block websites with content they deem offensive & may also take action against those who share such materials.

Bibles and resources are expensive to distribute - a printed ethnic Bible in South Africa now costs over R100. In other countries where Bibles are far more scarce, Bible printruns often grind to a halt and are very expensive.





Looking Back Home To Malawi.



A Play To Help Others Understand How Valuable the Witness of the Christian Testimony Is...

t is a generally accepted fact that people talk a lot about other people; and it seems more so when the people under discussion happen to be Christians - they are often not spoken of in a positive way. We are indeed "letters written by the Holy Spirit and read by fellow men" (2 Corinthians 3: 2-3 GNB) and because of this, it is essential that what people read in the letter of your life is Jesus Christ. I want to focus our attention on Daniel and on the conclusions people made when they looked at his life. King Darius, a heathen king made important conclusions... and his witness of Daniel's life was instrumental in spreading knowledge regarding God to the many nations under his rule. The ministers who worked in King Darius' government also saw that same witness in Daniel's life; and they spoke evil of him. To help people visitalise the importance of being a Christian witness as Daniel was, a short play in

acted out. The following may help you or your

Church to take this story to a level which speaks

Actors:

Narrator reading some text,

- → Daniel
- → 3–4 ministers
- → a few people gathering to see what would happen at the lion's den
- → 2 soldiers

Special notes:

If possible, use a picture of lions as background / on electronic board - only put up when applicable.

Daniel gets pushed out of sight on the side of the stage or behind a curtain or some enclosure. The king must later return to that spot. If possible (or optional) have sound of lions roaring before Daniel is pushed into the pit and then the roaring stops.

Play begins:

Scene 1:

Narrator reads from Daniel 6 vs 1-9. King on stage and ministers. One of them carry the scroll with the order. The ministers grab the scroll and exhibit big smiles. Looking back at where the king is sitting, they begin to talk to each other in an animated way, while leaving the stage.

1st minister (1): "Let's go and wait for Daniel near his house, today is the day!"

2nd minister (2): "Yes, he usually goes home at 12 o'clock, it is already a quarter to! Let's hurry!"

Scene 2:

A part of the stage has a bed, a chair, a frame of a window (which Daniel can open).

Daniel walks on stage, sits on the chair or bed for a quick moment (perhaps covering his face) considers for a moment what is happening. Then he gets up. He opens the window, looks out and kneels at the bed. Expression must be serious, but peaceful.

He folds his hands in prayer. After a few moments he lifts up his hands; his lips can form words of praise or better even say them out loud. He may even recite a sentence or two of Psalm 146 vs 1–2 as praise to the Lord. The next moment the ministers and soldiers rush in and pull Daniel up from his praying position, to stand between the soldiers. Daniel remains calm and peaceful. Go off-stage.

Scene 3:

On the side of the stage, spot near the lion's den, the ministers, soldiers, Daniel and the king. The king walks to Daniel.

Narrator reads Daniel 6 vs 14 to 15.

The king buries his head in his hands, looks at Daniel a last time. He says: May your God whom you always honour, save you! He then walks away (to the other side of the stage).

The soldiers push Daniel into the lion's den (if possible for production value add large photographs of lions accompanied by roaring sounds). The ministers give each other high fives. Lights dim to blackout to show that night is falling.

Scene 4:

(2 to 3 minutes pass). Then dimmed lights start to lighten the stage. Two soldiers guarding the spot near the lion's den.

The king hurries over the stage. Anxious, not in usual king's clothes. He calls out in a concerned voice (Daniel 6 vs 20 recited): "Daniel, servant of the living God! Was the God you serve so loyally able to save you from the lions?"

From backstage Daniel answers: "May Your Majesty live for ever! God sent his angel to shut the mouths of the lions so that they would not hurt me. He did this because He knew that I was innocent and because I have not wronged you, Your Majesty".

The king looks much happier and gives the order to the soldiers: "Throw down a rope and get Daniel out, immediately."

When Daniel comes on stage, helped by the soldiers, he looks just the same as before.

The king hugs him and says: "I could not sleep, I worried about you! How come you are not hurt? The lions are very hungry!"

Daniel repeats: "My God sent his angel to shut their mouths."

The king gives orders: "Get the ministers who accused Daniel here and throw them into the lion's den along with their families! And get the scribes, I want to send out a document proclaiming that Daniel's God is the only true God, He is a living God and He will rule forever!" Narrator reads Daniel 6 vs 25 – 28.

At the end of the play:

Church leaders can read Acts 4 vs 13. What people said about disciples – companions of Jesus.

The lesson with this play is this—it does not matter whether you and I are heroes of faith in a big way. If our lives testify of the living God, that is enough to bring honour to His Name.

Set From Spiritual Abuse



'LORD, you are mine! I promise to obey your words!' Psalm 119 vs 57 NLT

ow does this scripture in Psalm 119 compare with what most Christians seem to think about God? Most relate to the Lord Jesus as if the scripture says: "Lord I am yours! I will obey your words!" but this is wrong. The psalmist's declaration "Lord you are mine! I will obey..." is nothing less than a declaration that he had a love relationship with God.

No love relationship is forced, but rather consists of a voluntary commitment by both parties. This is why *John 6:67 (NLT)* recounts that when many of the lord Jesus' disciples departed from Him out of offense; He turned to the twelve Apostles who remained, asking: "Are you also going to leave?" He was not going to hold anyone back if they wanted to leave and go their way. In *John 14 verse 15 (NLT)* the Lord Jesus said to his disciples: "if you love me, obey my

commandments". This again confirms that a true experience with Christ has to be in the form of a free-will love relationship!

'Lord you are mine! I promise to obey your words!' also speaks of a Christ-empowering experience. Not only an empowering that enables us to obey God, but also to share this relationship and experience with others around us. Paul said in Colossians 1:27-29 (NLT). "Christ lives in you. This gives you assurance of sharing his glory. So we tell others about Christ, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all the wisdom God has given us. We want to present them to God, perfect in their relationship to Christ. That's why I work and struggle so hard, depending on Christ's mighty power that works within me."

There is no such thing as a vacuum in the natural or in the spiritual world. Things that are empty tend to get filled immediately, and oftentimes with something other than what was removed. If you therefore do not have the type of relationship with God that the Psalmist clearly



had, then you will have something else. Since nothing less than **Christ** in you is acceptable to God, this will be the right time to ask the Holy Spirit to show you what you have and if it is where God wants you to be in this season. Usually, the Spirit will point out to us that Jesus must be centrally aligned in our hearts.

Once we have settled the issue of having Jesus as the centre of our hearts, there is then another exercise that we must do. We must also look around and ensure that there is nothing from outside of us that is putting this "Jesus and I" relationship under threat. Again, we should ask the Holy Spirit to

show us those outside influences that are working to remove us from obeying Jesus Christ. That's why Ephesians 6 teaches us about putting on "the full armour of God". We must fight off every trick the enemy has to sever our relationship with Christ. Naturally, we see our enemies as the Devil and those in the world who prey on our weaknesses.

These outward threats include perhaps the most dangerous peril to any believer, namely threats from within the Church. Napoleon reportedly observed that "a spy in the right place is worth 20,000 soldiers on the battlefield". In the spiritual world it is much the same. The Devil knows full-well that an 'insider' in the Church can do tremendous damage, particularly if they are in a position of authority. This danger in Christian religious circles usually comes in two forms, namely:

Spiritual abuse in which a strong personality dominates the freewill of others to the point where their two-way relationship with Jesus is no longer existent or is very weak. Spiritual abuse in which a Church sect with unbiblical dogmas steals away the free-will relationship between their members and Christ. This gives rise to bitter Christians, who wonder how they could have gotten themselves involved 'with a God who is so harsh'. It isn't God who is harsh… it is people who have misrepresented God with an ungodly religious system.

We need therefore to ask the following questions...

- → Is the motive for the Church I attend /
 ministry I work with / Spiritual leader I serve
 to present me perfect before God?
- →Do they measure perfection as being a deeper relationship with Christ?
- → Do they work and struggle hard to achieve this and
- → Are they enabled by Christ's power working in them is it seen as fruit in their own lives?

If the answer to any of these questions is 'no', then you must start ministering to the Church or ministry or leader you are working with. If you cannot, due to internal politics, prayerfully consider moving on. Spiritual abuse may move you further from Jesus – so before that happens, or gets worse, take action. Look for a Christ-centred family of believers where you can find Godly fellowship. Remember, you are obligated to God, not to men.

Thankfully Jesus continues to build His Church and hell's gates cannot prevail. It is essential though, to draw near to Him and to rely on Him to include you in that building process. Having an ear to hear His every command will keep you safe and help you overcome the evergrowing dangers of spiritual abuse so prevalent in these last days.

ur destiny is to live with the Lord forever. Learning to live and conduct ourselves properly in God's presence is something God nurtures in us daily. Just because we have been made free and born again, does not mean that we throw out all good conduct. We need to learn that to dwell in the Father's presence, is to live in His house, by His household rules. These are not difficult to live under with His help - it is easy and light (Matthew 11:30). What happens if we find ourselves or someone else who is unwilling to live by the household rules of God? Would this be what some call **rebellion**? When we speak of rebelliousness, this is in context of rebellion against God Himself; the source of universal authority. When we reject God's authority and household rules we are in danger of being rebellious. If you consider yourself God's child - He will correct that rebellion in you in good time. According to the Oxford dictionary online...the word "rebel:

- 1. Showing a desire to resist authority, control, or convention.
- 1.1 Engaged in opposition or armed resistance to an established government or leader.
- 1.2 (of a thing) not easily controlled or kept in place. The Bible helps to understand why rebellion is so dangerous by giving us examples of men and women who acted rebelliously toward God. In almost every example we read are extreme cases. Please don't go reading this in fear or out of context.

King Saul's story has been a fascinating one. His anointing by God through the Prophet Samuel

and crowning as King was not meant to take place at all. The rebelliousness of Israel (God's people) was something deep-seated. God's intention was to raise up His children to become Kings or Priests in His Kingdom (1 Peter 2:9). The children of Israel rejected the authority of God and the order of His household in favour of authority delegated to a single man -A King. Through rebellion the children of Israel couldn't see how choosing a single King would play into the enemy's hands by stealing their kingly and priestly birthright and placing it into the hands of a single man. While the Lord allowed them to choose a King, he warned of the grief this choice had in store for them.

Rebellion likewise will put you in a place that steals you from the path of your godly birthright and destiny. God will many times allow you to have your own way, if only to show you just how wrong you can be. King Saul was the pinnacle example of what rebellion was; but his story is so much more different than many could begin to imagine. King Saul started his journey with one miracle after the next. God was still faithful, even though men were not. From the very beginning while reading through 1 Samuel 9 to 1 Samuel 11, you get the immediate impression that King Saul had incredible encounters with the Lord. The Father was wooing him, calling to be a King close to His heart. In this way He could offer protection for King Saul and His people. "the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits" (Daniel 11:32). Those who don't know their God can

cause situations to spiral out of control. King Saul was anointed by the Prophet Samuel (and the Holy Spirit) - similar to mighty men of God before, Samuel experienced powerful words of knowledge and prophecy. He had incredible faith and He saw how God turned the tide against Israel's greatest enemies and this led him to have powerful victories.

There came a shift in King Saul's heart one day; a seed that took root as rebellion. When the battle against the Philistines was close at hand, a blessing traditionally would be given for the victory of Israel's forces (Read 1 Samuel 13). This came in the form of a sacrifice carried out by a priest. This was the Prophet Samuel's responsibility and he was a little late for this appointment. Samuel had instructed King Saul to wait for him so that he could do the sacrifice. King Saul became concerned as Samuel's lateness made the soldiers uneasy and they began to scatter. Taking matters in his own hands, King Saul carried out the sacrifice on Samuel's behalf. King Saul's disobedience came about

because he believed God might let Israel down in battle. Even though King Saul had seen otherwise; he took hold of the accusing lie, that Satan planted against God. King Saul entertained the lie and acted on it by sacrificing to the Lord. He believed that his efforts would be valid to gain victory over his enemies. King Saul went ahead without Samuel and literally brought sacrifices on an altar of rebellion unto the Lord. Had only King Saul waited as God commanded him to!

God never asked King Saul to do feats of incredible strength or endurance or courage. He simply had to wait. Samuel arrived on time to witness King Saul's disobedience. He confronted King Saul and rebuked him for "making a plan" while Samuel was away. Samuel exclaimed saying "You have not kept the command the Lord your God gave you. Had you kept it, the Lord would have established your kingdom over Israel forever". 1 Samuel 13: 13 NLT. In 1 Samuel 14 we read that God still saved them from the battle. God wasn't cruel when He spoke through the Prophet Samuel

such hard words in 1 Samuel 13. God could see into King Saul's unrepentant heart, and He knew what a bitter seed of rebellion was germinating an altar of rebellion against the Lord. The Lord could see it was going to cause King Saul to self-destruct in the future; and, through Samuel's words, were showing the King that this was what could be expected when we heed the enemy's lies and rebel. King Saul had

never been dropped by the Lord before. If anything, all King Saul knew was the Lord's many blessings – there was no precedent in King Saul's reign to not trust God at all.

Now with that seeded lie of Satan came the altar of rebellion in King Saul's heart which motivated another defiant act against God. King Saul, during a victory against the Amalekites, an evil and ancient enemy of Israel spared the spoils of war and spared the Amalekite King. This was against the command of the Lord who told him to destroy everything of the Amalekites. Samuel delivered the final message from the Lord who had rejected Saul as King. Speaking against his disobedient aspirations Samuel said: "What is more pleasing to the Lord: your burnt offerings and sacrifices or vour obedience to his voice? Listen! Obedience is better than sacrifice, and submission is better than offering the fat of rams. Rebellion is as sinful as witchcraft, and stubbornness as bad as worshiping idols. So because you have rejected the command of the Lord, He has rejected you as king" (1 Samuel 15:22-23 NLT).

There is much to extract from the life of King Saul. Through the teachings of Jesus we can learn how to overcome what Saul failed to do. Jesus gives us the parable of the 2 sons (Read Matthew 21:28 – 31 NLT). From this parable we see that the answer to dealing with rebellion is turning our hearts back to God by coming to Jesus. He shows us that through repentance we can remove Altars of Rebellion that have been built up in our hearts toward the Father. When we see the enemy trying to sow seeds in our hearts we can bring every seed to Christ (2 Corinthians 10:5) before we make bitter judgements against the Lord that will steal our love for Him. You cannot trust one word that comes from Satan's mouth. He is the father of Lies (John 8:44). We need God's help in discerning which thoughts are from Him and which thoughts come from the Devil. We can find healing and deliverance from rebellion we have the advantage of Jesus' help. We can no longer excuse or entertain seeds that sow rebellion, neither can we accept Altars that celebrate disobedience against God's household rule. Find release from all rebellion by turning to serve the living God. If

Are We Giving Sufficient Offence?

hen the disciples came and said to Him, "Do You know that the Pharisees were offended when they heard this statement?" Matt 15:12, NIV

Of course, by asking the question in today's title, I'm not suggesting that we embark on an unloving and ungracious lifestyle. Jesus never exhibited these characteristics. However, His words and His life constantly caused offence with those who believed that they had religious or ideological superiority.

Apart from the main world religions, the dominant ideology of today is humanistic and strongly promoting ill-defined notions of equality, inclusivity and liberty. The God-centred message of the Bible regarding sin, and the need for divine forgiveness, is considered repressive, restrictive and an outdated concept. It is seen as the enemy of a man-centred quest for freedom. Jesus stepped into the world two thousand years ago and defined the meaning of true freedom. He said that it was release from spiritual bondage and could only be achieved by receiving God's forgiveness through a relationship with Himself. He dismissed, as worthless, the beliefs and behaviours of the religious elite, causing considerable offence in the process.

Today His words, which can only be voiced through His Body on earth, will be equally

offensive to those who have invested their lives in a culture of self-determined entitlement. The culture of God's Kingdom and the concepts of the Bible must, in their understanding, be progressively neutralised and dismantled. We shouldn't be surprised at the increasing hostility towards a faithful gospel message, however gracious the delivery might be.

We don't like not being liked. Of course, we should not give offence by the manner of our presentation of biblical truth, but to compromise that truth in order to find a measure of acceptance with the world's views, will never help to transform lives in the way that God has planned, through the radical message of Jesus.

Prayer: Father God, I want to avoid offending others by unloving and ungracious behaviour, but I want to be unafraid of the truth of the Bible or of giving offence to those caught in spiritual bondage. Please help me. Amen.




n adult cannot teach everything to a child. Dad and Mom don't crawl continually in front of their babies until they get the hint. Children learn most of their early skills themselves, and parents have to sit back and wait for that development to take place. Parents cannot take shortcuts here, though many have tried. Well-meaning folk have even attempted to cut out the crawling phase of babyhood by placing babies in suspended walkers. Only recently have researchers realised that this leads to arrested development.

In like manner, the Lord wants succeeding generations to discover Jesus and His revelation for themselves. Christ is the perfect head of His Body. As such, He has no respect of persons in His heart - so why would some generations think the Lord would discriminate against people of different generations? His abilities are available for all believers, for His arm is ever strong!

Abraham knew the Lord as "Jehovah Jireh" - the Lord, my provider (See Genesis 22:14) He didn't read it in a manual, God revealed His Character to him.

Parents try their best to shield their children from disaster as they grow up – such as placing covers over electrical sockets and storing household chemicals on the top shelf. But in being overprotective, researchers have discovered a child's development can be stunted into adulthood. For example parents disinfect their homes with powerful cleaning agents meant to protect children from harm. A home that is too sterile can actually increase allergy risks and asthma. A little bit of dust and dirt is actually far healthier for your offspring in the long run. The situation works in very much the same way in a spiritual sense too. Older generations tasked with leading the way should not operate from a basis of fear to shield younger Christians. Stifling all experiences out of fear of them getting hurt will deny them critical life experience. A sterile Christian



environment based only on teachings will establish within them a very narrow understanding of the spiritual realm. While no leader should be careless with those in their care; micro-management-type shepherding intended to shield younger believers, may only serve to flatten them instead.

In Matthew 18:10 the Lord Jesus said; "Beware that you don't look down on any of these little ones. For I tell you that in heaven their angels are always in the presence of my heavenly Father". These words make it very clear that little children have an amazing standing in the sight of God. Young believers should be treated by Christians with the same measure of respect as Jesus has for them. From the passages above we can also see that God delights in interacting personally with his children as any real father does. How would you like it, however, if your child returned home from kindergarten saying; "I don't want to be with you any more Mom or Dad! My teachers tell me I can experience all that your relationship with me has to offer, through listening to them." How sad such parents would be - they would feel

teachers' take His place. Like us, He wants not just rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials, to relate to His children, but also to joyfully interact with them! All believers, especially immature ones should keep their hearts and minds eager to learn, discover and experience new things, in all humility, from the Father personally. That's why Paul said in 1 Timothy 4:12; "Don't let anyone think less of you because you are young" to his eager student Timothy.

It is not that we reject the lessons of the past or teaching, in fact, we embrace them. Hebrews 5:14 (NLT) says that "Solid food is for those who are mature, who through training have the skill to recognize the difference between right and wrong." In other words, immature believers cannot discern everything immediately; it takes a lifetime of learning. Once again I reiterate Hebrews 5:14: "those... who through training have the skill." God wants more for believers than their simply being pushed through an intellectual teaching programme by the Church.

The story of Job consists primarily of three theorists coming across an experienced man of God whom the Lord was honing to perfection. They were a stumbling block, not a help to him. It took a younger, spirit-led believer named Elihu to correctly begin admonishing Job. He was permitted to do this until God personally stepped in. The Lord fully corrected Job for his negative attitude. After dealing with Job, He then turned to his three friends. He reproved them for misrepresenting Him in their instruction to Job, and told them to go to Job for prayer. No wonder James 3:1 (NLT) says; "Dear brothers and sisters, not many of you should become teachers in the church, for we who teach will be judged more strictly."

Perhaps the reason most Christians prefer just receiving teaching, and not also undergoing experience, is because of the suffering associated

robbed! God feels the same way when 'theory-only with the growing. Romans 5:3 (NLT) says; "We can for we know that they help us develop endurance. And endurance develops strength of character, and character strengthens our confident hope of salvation. And this hope will not lead to disappointment. For we know how dearly God loves us, because He has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with His love". We see from this that God uses life's circumstances to develop us spiritually. (See also James 1:2-4). The result of such an experience-based walk with God is love, which is "...the bond of perfectness". This is an eternal asset, which will bring much future reward for any believer.

> Let's steer away from theory only, by steering in the direction of the Lord Jesus. Let us wait on the Holy Spirit and ask Him to give us the experiences with Christ that we need. Such interaction with our Lord brings out the spiritual fruit we need to bear (See John 15:4-5). God can teach a believer to love. Many Churches struggle to do it, because they usually tend to only preach it. God takes a believer through experiences as well as teaching in a way people cannot do. Since nobody can undergo experiences on another believer's behalf, trusting on the experience of others is just not an option for any believer. Nevertheless, many do, and the consequences are always spiritually detrimental for them. (See 1 Corinthians 8:1-2). Never be impatient and try to bypass God's way of doing things. Instead of 'storing up wisdom' for younger believers, the older generation's primary goal should be to teach them how to depend on God for everything. Whether we are older or younger believers though, our greatest need is to learn to discern the truth for ourselves. Let us learn to see, taste, hear and feel like little children do. Let nobody rob you of the experience of getting there with God.

he Church is called the house of the Lord. There we meet as His children with Father, Son and Holy Spirit; and together we visit as God's family at the Father's table. bitter, and they stay away from ABBA's house and do not want to sit together at His table. I believe it hurts His heart so much. Just imagine how your earthly parents would feel going through this with their children. "Go visit them, pray for the sick, bring the lost souls so that I can accept and welcome them into the family. Also reach out to your family in Father's house in other cities and countries. Forgive each other as I forgave you, restore the relationship. Be one as I and the Father are one. Go and make disciples of all nations. Encourage each other. Communicate with each other. Ask about each other's well-being. Visit My House Out of Love for Father, Son, Holy Spirit and fellow brothers and sisters. Sit at my table in love and peace."

Talk to Father and listen to Him. Accept His hospitality and His attempts to keep and bind the family together. He wants to prove His love towards us. How can we expect Father to listen to us throughout the week, help us, sit at our table and spend time with us, if we do not even want to spend time with Him on His day at His table? Asia in the Spotlight

e are a year closer to Christ's coming and that makes us very exited. On the other hand, we know that there are still millions waiting to hear the message of redemption and salvation. Even in the Philippines, which according to popular opinion is a Christian land, there are still millions on the many islands who are still waiting and who have still not learned the fullness and truth of being a Christian. In other parts of Asia the need is still greater. During 2019 we must return to the Philippines for a visit to sort out matters with the team members, especially because there will be potential new members added. Their involve-ment must still be assessed and decided upon. As usual I will stay on the campus of Asia Pacific Theological Seminary.

IN THE PHILIPPINES

Below you will see some parts of recent reports of our Filipino team. We start with Imelda Sedano, a hardworking person, faithful in

ministry. Despite from the fact that she has also quite a full time office job as secretary for a congress member; she gives attention to some 10 Bible Studies each week. She often receives people in her office who are coming for help because of sickness or debt at hospitals. There are many times when, if they ask for help, they receive something, even if it is



partial financial aid. She writes about a certain Mrs Bravo, these are her words: "She came to my office and asked help for her depression and she said while she was praying, the Lord brought to her mind my face so she searched on face book and found where I was working. She was a former daycare teacher of Crystal Cave (a suburb where the Conradie family lived earlier) but due to life's trials, she left and went through a cycle of depression. I led her and her husband to scriptures pointing out to them that life has no meaning without Jesus. As I asked them if they were willing to give their lives to Jesus and accept Him as Saviour and Lord, they gladly said, 'Yes!' Praise Jesus."

In such a wonderful way the Lord uses her, almost day by day.

Further on, we would also like to quote a part of Ludy Niturada's report. He writes as follows: "Thank God for opening doors to share His love and purpose for other people. I want to thank God also that my son committed

his life to God's Ministry. He is now our assistent youth pastor. He is aiming to go to seminary after his college graduation." Ludy further writes that they will use him more and more for all kinds of outreach at the one High School and in this case he had to deliver a speech and the theme of the outreach session was "The Purpose of a Teacher". He told us that he was quite nervous but that the Lord undertook in such a way, and the hearts of those who heard it were so touched, that tears were flowing. He mentioned specifically that one must take note

that life does not end here, but that we must build our lives with the purpose and assurance that our last place will be with the living God in heaven.

IN CAMBODIA

We are very sad that Linda Pinchigan retired at from her wonderful work in Cambodia at the end of 2018. We want to quote something of her latest little newsletter: "Our God is always at work with us by faith, because I see Him only by faith now. (Mark 4:26-29.) Our job is to sow the seed of the Word of God. Others will water, it is the Lord who makes it grow. The good thing is that we can know what the Lord has called us to do... so we don't compare our work, nor

ourselves, with others and their work. Whether great or small, we aim to glorify our Lord and to finish our assignment well.
Since this is my last term in this mission field, I am glad to testify of the goodness and faithfulness of the Lord in my life and ministry.

Hundreds of children, young people and adults have asked

Jesus into their hearts; have been for water baptism; but only a few are faithfully coming to church and are actively involved in ministry. Some migrated to other provinces. Some are hindered by parents who are from other faiths. But many of them may have become like the prodical son too. Nevertheless there are still some who are faithful and daring. Thank God that some of these have graduated university and are now working professionals yet are still actively involved and dedicated to the church and its ministries. We are also calling in prayer for the return of the prodical sons and daughters before its too late. Just recently, one of our young people and her younger sister courageously shared the word of God to their

father and he accepted Jesus as His Lord and saviour. A few days later, their Father died. At the funeral these two sisters were much comforted in the hope that they will meet their father again in God's Kingdom, because he became born again before he died. My greatest joy is to see the few committed and faithful Christian believers growing victorious in faith, serving the Lord courageously and overcoming the enemy by sharing their testimony.

The pastor that was installed last March used to be one of our Sunday-school children some 15 years ago. When she grew as a youth, I trained her to teach in the kindergarten where she got involved for some time."

"Adopt a Junky" Give back a person


hen we are children, we often believe we are going to make an impact in the world. History will remember us! We love being the heroes of our own lives and those around us. Kids are the main character in this adventure, and by the time we leave school, our minds are dead set on changing the world. Then the hard reality of the big world hits us, and we suddenly realise that the world works in a different hierarchy, it is then that our expectations get adjusted, very quickly. This is no different for our friends that we meet living in the streets, sleeping under the bridges and sidewalks of Pretoria's Central Business District. Their expectations have to be adjusted much sooner in life and the socio-economic environment where they grew up, has exposed

them to a very different world than you and I know. Most of the people we find living on the streets have some sort of addiction. Mostly "Nyaope".

Nyaope is a street drug, that consists of a cocktail of illegal drugs, consisting of "bad" heroin and Marijuana "dagga" as main ingredients.

Does this mean that God has turned His back on these people? Certainly not. We have been ministering to homeless people for 12 years and we have seen an impact that no words could ever capture. We have seen how in a moment God opens deaf ears and opens blind eyes. Heals in a moment a man that was scheduled for amputation of both legs. Not only heals them physically, but we see how these people start disappearing from the streets, only to hear later on, that they





found permanent employment. Having said that, we have also seen how some people who have grabbed hold of God, in true relationship with Him, still struggle in breaking that last bit of addiction. This is why the body of Christ is so important... This is where our story of Morné comes in. He was broken and angry when we met him in 2010. He only wanted the food that we handed out, but was not open to speak to us. If he did speak to us, it was with slander and curse words. We just kept on going back and loving him as we truly believe Jesus would have, growing in relationship with him, little by little. One evening in 2017 while praying for people on the streets, Morné was there, not open for prayer for himself, but he requested prayer for his sister. God radically did something in her life after that evening, and we saw how Morné opened up. He started coming to us whenever he saw us, requesting not just food, but prayer.

We started hearing stories of how he started working parttime in a nearby restaurant and how small groups of homeless men started gathering to hear the word of God, that he read to them. Early in 2018 he came to me and asked if we can help him to get rid of the drugs. At that stage he was using on average 15 bags per day. I told him that if he'll commit, I'll commit. If he can bring down his usage to 1 bag a day and keep it there for a minimum of 6 months, then I'll make sure we find sponsors and a decent drug rehab that can help him.

He brought down his usage to two bags a day, because of the intense withdrawal and kept it down. God opened doors and we could place him in a decent drug rehabilitation centre. It was important that he be taken away from the lifestyle that he was living and we enrolled him in a six month programme. Morne is almost finished with it. To see how he found new purpose and desire for life makes all these years of consistently going back to the streets with the message of a loving King worthwhile. We are in search for him for employment, but I also know that trusting God means that

something will open up to make this change permanent.

When Jesus said to His disciples "Go then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples, baptise them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you" (Matt 28: 19-20). He didn't say to leave everything behind, and move to another country. You can make a major impact in someone's life right here in your own country, in your own neighbourhood. You can be someone's hero and history will remember you!


We pray that FEBA would be favoured to continue further and brighter than ever before in the desire to reach losts souls for the Lord Jesus.

Many people came to the open air meeting for the children's Gospel celebration on the 24th of December 2018. The children's program always brings about a connection to the parents. We hope that more parents will come back in 2019 to be followed up.

During this time a new couple was added to the Kingdom, they are fishermen in our village, baptized in water and the Holy Spirit. They have a good testimony of God's divine Grace; even though once they had a lot of fear and trouble. After coming to Jesus they have more joy and their faith is growing daily. They are eager to learn as we disciple them, and already are evangelizing and praying for people. Through this couple we made a connection with another fishing family. This is what its all about...

2019 starts with Baptisms!

We started the year with two more baptisms. One is Lakshmi she is 19 years old and the daughter of an older couple who are caretakers. Lakshmi has gone through a lot of physical abuse after she told her parents she wanted to be baptised. Her persecution was so serious that she had an open wound on her face from beatings. She was so discouraged when I called on her one day, but I encouraged her not to worry, feel sad or to try and hide. We reminded her that she was persecuted not because Jesus was angry with her; but because the enemy wants to stop her from reaching her destiny. We continued to pray for Lakshmi who eventually and secretly was baptised on the 1st of January 2019. She is so full of joy, and ready to face whatever may come. A few days later, Lakshmi confessed to her parents that she was baptised, and they then testified of a complete change in her life. Hallelujah. Not long after that, Lakshmi was filled with the Spirit.

The second lady to be baptised was Ratama who was also baptised secretly. Ratama had had many demons that possessed her, but when she came to us at our local Church she was prayed for and delivered of all them. She keeps coming to Church with the permission of her husband and grown sons, but they prevent her from doing more for her faith. Her husband will most probably beat her publicly if he finds she has been baptised. This is what happens in India with

women and Christians. We are trusting that God will turn things around for her and her family. We had to also keep her baptism secret from the Church because the believers, in their excitement, may cause Ratama's secret to get out to her family. Please pray for Ratama that the Holy Spirit will prepare her family's heart.

Threats of Closure

Continue to pray for our Church please. It is almost certain that the church building will be demolished this year as the local Government needs to build a road through where the property stands. The road works have already started. We trust God for land and with a new building in the village. How this will happen, we cannot tell. We just know it will happen because with God all things are possible. The current building sits in a place where many people stop by to come sit and pray. It is on the main road of the beach and many visitors to the beach from near and far make a stop at the Church. We believe that the Holy Spirit touches people's lives who come there... even just to sit in God's presence. The fishing couple is a testimony of that. They used to come to the Church and just sit without us knowing. This went on for many years. God touched their hearts over the years and today they are part of the fellowship. Our Church is not a fancy building and it doesn't even have chairs; but our focus is on Jesus.

- → Pray for more salvations and baptisms to come soon. The Spirit is working...
- → Pray also for me and Raj to be able to go to South Africa at the end of March. It will be Raj's first time. I am praying that God will allow us a month's rest and time to fix my documents. Thanks for praying with us.

empower children; and break the strongholds of Satan. These strongholds operate in the lives of many people and are often strongholds regarding the areas of human sexuality. Pornography, sexual abuse, prostitution and human trafficking remain frightening tools that oppress many.

Our God is far more powerful than any stronghold that the enemy can use to oppress and break down. Through sharing the truth about our value; the love of God; Godly destiny and redemption from brokenness—the lives of many can be restored.

2018 may not have seemed like a busy year on the outside; but much preparation needs to go into an outreach. Annelize Fourie has worked as the area facilitator to ensure that all is kept running

smoothly. From the creative teams who spend hours to produce a single doll; to the prayer initiatives that see God open doors for us. One particular story of interest is an outreach to a Sunnyside Primary School with 1800 children. In 2012 EAR2HEAR approached Mariehette Boshoff, a physcial-education teacher at the school. We asked her to speak to the principal, to see if they would be willing to allow us to come and bring the message to the children. It took several years and many inquiries by Mariehette, but eventually through much prayer and the Lord's intervention, the doors swung open for us.




