He must become more. I must become less

John the Baptist said the words. He must become more, I must become less", referring to the fact that his group of followers decreased as many people went to join the group that followed Jesus (John 3:30). But I think it was not just words, it revealed the focus of his life. He used the opportunity to clearly state that the people themselves could testify that he had said, "I am not the Christ" but was sent ahead of Him. He then goes on to explain that the bride belongs to the bridegroom. The friend who attends to the bridegroom waits and listens for him, and is full of joy when he hears the bridegroom's voice (John 3: 28-29). He concluded "that joy is mine and it is now complete".

He must have known about his miracle birth when his parents were already old; how an angel appeared to Zechariah and spoke a prophecy over his life: that he would go before the Lord.

He would make ready a people prepared for the Lord as was already mentioned in Malachi 3:1. The angel also mentioned that he would be filled with the Holy Spirit even from birth (Luke 1:16). You will be called a prophet of the Most High (Luke 1:76-80), And the child grew and became strong in spirit and he lived in the desert until he appeared publicly to Israel. His clothes were made of camel's hair and he had a leather belt around his waist (Matthew 3:4 and 5). His food was locusts and wild honey. Even in those days such a life of simplicity was out of the ordinary.

He was humble and at first, did not want to baptise Jesus. He said that he was not worth fastening his shoelaces. He gave honour and praise to Jesus when he exclaimed," There is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! "(John 1:29). He also testified after Jesus was baptised and the Holy Spirit came upon Him: I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God.

John's words "He must become more, I must become less" also encourages us to think of a higher level towards which we should strive.

Paul prayed for the Ephesians, and all readers, that they all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God, as they mature to the full measure of the stature of Christ.

We need to consider how to achieve this goal. We must grow in love for God, in awe, praise of God, thankfulness, surrendering, obeying the soft voice of the Spirit. We must adopt the same attitude as that of Christ, He emptied himself by assuming the form of a servant (Philippians 2:5 -8). Have a fixed time for reading the Bible and praying. Like a cell phone's battery, your inner being must be charged regularly. Keep focus amidst busy daily life situations, and renew your thoughts and the way you look at circumstances.

Another person whose life is recorded in the Bible in much detail is that of Joseph (Genesis 37, 39, 40-44, 50). He suffered in the pit, was sold as a slave, and was innocently thrown into prison and the Bible states: God was with him and showed extended kindness to him (Genesis 39: 21-23). Here we read how Joseph experiences God's faithful love saying: "the LORD was with Joseph in the prison and showed him his faithful love".

And remember he did not know the final outcome of his life story as we now know it! When he later was second in charge in Egypt, he said these remarkable words: "What you intended against me for evil, God intended for good, in order to accomplish a day like this; to bring it about that many people should be kept alive" (Genesis 50:20).

Daniel is also a person whose focus was on the Lord when he kept on praying to the Lord despite risking being thrown into the lion's' den, which indeed happened. Darius, a heathen king, called out to him the next morning: "Daniel, servant of the living God, was your God whom you serve faithfully, able to save you from the lions?" You can read the result and the decree that Darius sent to every dominion of his kingdom (Daniel 6: 26 – 28).

Many martyrs through the ages up to today, kept their focus on the Lord, honouring Him and His kingdom.

Recently I attended a memorial service where the pastor spoke about his wife's death. She suddenly lifted both arms into the air but she had been so fragile and tired as a result of her cancer, that the previous day she could not lift her hand!

She looked up and seemed to be seeing something or Someone and then passed away. This same experience was confirmed by another lady who spoke about her mother's death, as well as another friend who stood at a believer's deathbed.

My own mother's prayer the last time when I could visit her, was a confirmation to me that not even a brain tumour and cancer which had spread through her body could erase what had been her prayer, her belief and her attitude through many years. She had at a time experienced depression after her eldest brother died at a very young age. She prayed the following sentence fluently:

"Dear Lord let us wake up with a first thought of thankfulness towards You."

During those days a brain tumour had prevented her from speaking a whole sentence; she would stop after three words! That sentence was one that she had often used to end her prayers when she and I had prayed together since I was a teenager

...and I was 34 years old at the time of her illness and death.

Indeed these persons were more focused on God than on themselves, He had become greater, they had become less by His grace! Praise His Name!

I can only bow my head in prayer trusting God: He who began a good work in you (and me) will bring it to completion on the day of Jesus Christ (Philippians 1:6) †



JESUS OUR INSPIRATION



He Must Increase But I Must Decrease!

"You yourselves bear me witness, that I said, 'I am not the Christ, but I have been sent before him.' The one who has the bride is the bride groom. The friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly at the bride groom's voice. Therefore, this joy of mine is now complete. He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:28-30, ESV). John the Baptist was one of the greatest Bible characters of Jesus' time. By the time Jesus was introduced to the scene, John had a very successful ministry with many people coming to him to be baptised. After he had introduced Jesus as the Messiah and Lamb of God, some of John's followers started to leave him to follow Jesus. Some of John's disciples were concerned and pointed out to him that Jesus was starting to be more popular than him. The response of John the Baptist is stunning, especially in today's world where popularity is sought after by all possible means.

John pointed out that he was only a friend to the bridegroom and that his joy was complete by hearing that Jesus was gaining a greater following than his. He concluded by saying, 'He must increase but I must decrease'.

How hard these words are ... to absolutely decrease, while Jesus increases! Most of the time we make these words mean: "He must increase, and I must increase with Him". But, to John the Baptist, it was: "He must increase, but I must decrease". The 'must' was not only about Jesus increasing, but also about John decreasing. John saw both as things that had to happen. He didn't want to take anything from the glory that Jesus deserves. This allowed many people - including you and I – to focus on Jesus and put our faith in Him, instead of focusing on John the Baptist.



How many times do we stand in the way of others seeing Jesus and believing in Him because we want to increase with Him? He's called us to be His witnesses wherever He sends us. But how often do we point people to ourselves and to our ministries and our churches, instead of pointing people to Him? How often do we portray ourselves as the most important person, instead of Christ? He must increase, we must decrease.

Prayer: Father God, forgive me for the times I portrayed myself as important, instead of Christ. I pray for a humble heart and for a continued reverence for Your Son, Jesus Christ. May He increase, while I decrease every day. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen. †

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A Global Trend

Narcissism is a relatively new concept for people. For the last two decades, behavioural scientists have continued to observe this particular personality disorder with great interest. As the world changes we see there are growing concerns about this issue as it ripples through society. For example, more and more couples are filing for divorce because of a spouse with narcissistic tendencies.

Young people no longer discuss marriage in terms of choosing life partners that "complement" one another's personality. Today, young people insist everything must be the same - personality, temperament, looks, likes and dislikes. There are great expectations that this is the recipe for success. These relationships often end up with one partner being abused when they fail to meet their partner's expectations. In extreme circumstances, when a narcissist in a relationship is facing a very low point in self-esteem, they will go out of their way to make their partner miserable, so that they can feel better about themselves.

Encyclopedia Britannica defines Narcissism as...

...usually diagnosed through clinical evaluation. It is defined by the fifth edition (2013) of DSM in terms of the personality traits of grandiosity & attention-seeking and in terms of significant impairments in personality functioning—such as looking excessively to others for the regulation of self-esteem, viewing oneself as exceptional, having impaired empathy, and having mostly superficial relationships. Those qualities remain relatively stable over time and are not attributable primarily to a medical condition, the use of drugs, or the individual's developmental stage. Researchers have also investigated a less-extreme form of narcissism that is termed the narcissistic personality type. Such individuals possess most or all of the characteristics of the narcissistic personality disorder but are considered within the normal range of personality.

Terms like "gaslighting" have been coined by scientists to explain how narcissists try to make their partners feel like they are "stupid" or "crazy" by sabotaging their loved ones in various ways; then the narcissist blames their partner as if they are the cause of the problems. Narcissism is not only affecting marriages but wherever relationships are important. From families to the work environment narcissism is on the risel

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Ultimately, if we had to define narcissism - it is varying degrees of self-obsession to the point of self-harm and/or harming of others. Should we be surprised by this global pandemic? Of course not. The lifestyles of billions of people have changed in the last 2 decades thanks to the advent of social media platforms.




"Each report requires you to put your best foot forward"

For the last 20 years, society has been conditioned to report back on their lives through these platforms by taking "selfies" or self-portrait photographs using phones or computers. Each report or social media post requires you to put your best foot forward. So each self-portrait must be perfect. No blemishes or wrinkles. Smartphones come with artificial intelligence applications that automatically remove imperfections.

These social platforms ask you to give feedback not just of your face, but of every detail of life, holidays, and relationships - and they must all be shown in a good light. The better the photos and videos the more you stand out among the social connections who may follow various profiles and day-to-day activities. To further the problem, a positive reinforcement system is used to encourage users to "feed" the platform. You can send a heart or a thumbs-up to the person sharing every detail of their life. The more thumbs-ups or hearts you receive the greater your success at getting people's attention. Social media companies exploit the narcissistic tendencies of their users to mine (collect) their personal data and repackage it to sell it to businesses with large marketing needs.

Society has been engineered to help human development to remain immature. An immaturity will lead to insecurity and a fragile perception of self. The system helps people to build a frail image of themselves, with no real identity or purpose of self. The **obsession** with the self makes it harder and harder to reach beyond and love other people.



While social media provides us with an amazing way for lost friends and family to connect, and for open communication channels for business. More and more are starting to see and feel how the cost of social media is starting to outweigh the benefits.

Jesus warned us in the Gospel of Matthew 24:12

TPT concerning the last days: "There will be such an increase of the sin of lawlessness that those whose hearts once burned with passion for God and others will grow cold."

In the past, the world may not have had a perfect love, but in many places, love was shown to us through the neighbourly concern. Jesus describes a time when people would be completely engrossed within themselves, in the world and the Church. Even the "little love" that could be found at one point in time would be replaced with self-obsession and self-aggrandizing behaviour. Paul the Apostle wrote in his last letter to Timothy and warned him of terrible times that would be seen in the world to come. Almost 2000 years later and his predictions are absolutely spot-on for this time. The Church is also a victim of this social engineering. So many are coming under the trance of the evil one.

The Difficulty with the Self-Obsessed?

"You should know this, Timothy, that in the last days there will be very difficult times. For people will love only themselves and their money. They will be boastful and proud, scoffing at God, disobedient to their parents, and ungrateful. They will consider nothing sacred. They will be unloving and unforgiving; they will slander others and have no self-control. They will be cruel and hate what is good. They will betray their friends, be reckless, be puffed up with pride, and love pleasure rather than God. They will act religious, but they will reject the power that could make them godly. Stay away from people like that!" 2 Timothy 3:1-6 TPT

Paul paints a grim picture for Timothy; of a world that stands on the edge of total chaos. Self-obsessed, self-interested, and self-praising. The Apostle James and the Apostle Peter in their letters to the Church, speak clearly on the grave sin of pride. In essence they summarise Proverbs 3:34 in which they say: "God resists you when you are proud but continually pours out grace when you are humble." (James 4:6; and 1 Peter 5:5)

God Resists the Proud

The Online Dictionary defines pride as "thinking too highly of oneself; conceited, arrogant, or overconfident"

It is this heart and mind attitude that God is resisting. When people experience resistance in life, it can be bothersome. But when the Lord of heaven and earth resists us, it is very serious!

Narcissists tend to have one thing in common from what I have seen in dealing with them from a ministry perspective - their lives are shaken (and sometimes fall apart) when circumstances confront the shortcomings and personal failures. Their relationships tend to shatter when they are self-absorbed. The fragile egos that they desperately work so hard to build and nurture at the expense of others tend to experience hit after hit. This is God's active resistance. God's grace is extended to those who are willing to humble themselves. Humility is not the same as self-deprecation or self-humiliation. True humility is seeing yourself from the right perspective.



To see yourself in correct relation to God and others is essential. Doing this is to attempt to look past the lies of Satan that distort reality. It is to see the truth and embrace it. This transforming work only God can do! When you have little time to love and serve God... or others around you - it may be that you are too busy with yourself. The real danger comes when we get bored with the world rotating around us.

No person is or should be the centre of existence. Only God should be our all. God did not design us to live for ourselves, nor are we created to serve our selfish desires exclusively. We are designed to reach beyond ourselves with love, compassion, empathy and justice. Jesus himself taught this in various places by instructing His audiences that they are to...


"Love the Lord your God with every passion of your heart, with all the energy of your being, and with every thought that is within you. This is the great and supreme commandment. And the second is like it in importance: You must love your friend in the same way you love yourself. Contained within these commandments to love you will find all the meaning of the Law and the Prophets."

Matthew 22:37-40 TPT

With this command. Jesus instructs people to return to the purpose of their original design. Much of the mess humanity finds itself in comes from the way humans do not pursue this mandate. This is how we fall short of God's glory. This is why so many remain in sin and deep brokenness through fear. The poor self-image and fragile ego found in narcissists is a symptom of the deep-seated fear that many experience in their day-to-day lives. This behaviour is so different to that of Jesus, who came to serve and lay His life down for the sins of the world. His worthy example, in stark contrast to that of the narcissist, remains for all to see.

Fears that narcissists face include: A fear of rejection. A fear of punishment. A fear of failure. A fear of inadequacy. A fear of being misperceived. A fear of exposure, shame or humiliation.

FEAR is such a powerful driver for the choices of so many. If we are willing to humble ourselves before God, to sit at His feet we may be surprised to hear what good things He has to say about us. Things that don't just prop up a fragile ego or feed our insecurities. God wants to tell us loving, eternal truths that build our identity in Jesus Christ. Find yourself at the feet of Jesus. Open and willing to



learn about perfect love. It is at this place that He

"Love never brings fear, for fear is always related to punishment. But love's perfection drives the fear of punishment far from our hearts. Whoever walks constantly afraid of punishment has not reached love's perfection..." (1 John 4:18 TPT).

From what we read in this scripture, fear is related to punishment - many see any sort of correction, help or suggestion as a punishment. This stems largely from the formative years - when a young person is held to misperceived or real unreachable standards. Failure brings a torrent of consequences and punishment. This causes the narcissist to question everyone's motives. They see every gesture of help toward them as an attack on them for their inadequacy. Their fragile identity is very wounded and as such cannot handle any more perceived attacks, no matter how well-meaning those around them are. Like a wounded animal, trapped in a corner, they lash out at all around them. While we are called to be careful in relationships, especially with those we open our hearts to, narcissists are never able to open themselves up to genuine people who care for them deeply.



In the end the relationships remain shallow and unfulfilling. Every person's love toward them is put into question and rejected for fear that their motives are wrong.

Social media works similarly as young people risk themselves on public platforms, exposing their personal photos, ideas, opinions and creativity to harsh and unloving comments and criticism. Instead of sharing these things in a safe space among friends and family who build and guide the younger person toward a healthy self-perception and identity, they are at risk of targeted remarks and malicious comments on a public platform. When young people are bullied in this way, it contributes to a further breakdown of the person's ego.

That is why so many fragile self-esteem issues (such as seen in teens) result in folk building a false image of themselves on social media. Very few young people have the maturity to use social media freely without supervision, yet many do so without good guidance or a healthy, balanced view of self.

Can a Narcissist Be Helped?

No one is beyond God's help. God can heal the brokenhearted, His Spirit releases prisoners and captives. But the narcissist must be willing to open up to God's righteous judgement of their situation. Judgement is no the same as condemnation. Judgement is a true assessment from God's perspective, concerning the state of affairs of our lives. The cross of Jesus reminds us of all of our inadequacies, sins and failures. Not to shame us, but to put within us a conviction that we need help and a Saviour. This is challenging for a narcissist to receive and hear because of the fragility of their self-esteem. We have heard and seen how brave individuals have embraced humility and have come to Jesus with all their sin and brokenness to find salvation and redemption!



GOD gave them a new identity in Jesus and healed them of all their past hurts. This is the transforming power of Christ at work - the breakthrough we need. Together with our obedience to Love God with all our heart, Romans 12:1-2 explains to us tells us that He imparts to us a desire not to be self-obsessed but to lay our lives down as a living sacrifice to God. This is the recovery journey that helps people live for more than their own self-image. We are also instructed to love our neighbour as ourselves - in other words, the Holy Spirit should be given the space He wants in our lives to help us translate the energy we put into obsessing about ourselves, into powerful acts of love and service for His Kingdom!

Remember, to protect the next generation we must set the example and use technology responsibly! We are living in a different world than the previous generations. Technology is part of this world - and a necessity. It is time we take control of technology. Instead of shaping ourselves to move with the currents of technology. Technology should be allowed in our lives with healthy boundaries. Social media provide valuable services.

We have a collective responsibility as the Church needs to train families to use social media - instead of social media using them! The older generations that know how to engage technology correctly, had someone to teach them. Likewise, when it comes to using social media correctly, the knowledge must be proactively taught to our young people. Only safe and acceptable personal information should be shared with one's inner circles and the rest of the world. The added problem of sexual predators should also cause us to teach our children to be careful. The primary target of predators are those with poor self-esteem, isolating them from their community. Encourage team activities to discourage isolation tendencies among this generation. I love February month, not only because I was able to have my 50th Birthday but since my childhood, it has always been a beautiful month - can't explain

It's been a three-year Journey with Bhagya Raj. From finding him in a hut made with leaves dying of TB to getting him through to a hospital for the second time and ending up with him being baptized and settled in proper accommodation.

What a journey. His health is better. Breathing with slight difficulty still since he has only one lung and with his heart weakened it's quite common that he gets tired easily.

He has loads of faith that God is going to restore his heart and lungs completely. We found comfortable rented accommodation for him with one of our co-worker's, bro Ramy. He is settled and happy and they take very good care of him. A lot of brokenness was healed too. He lost his mom when he was one and a half years old. His dad left after that. He has grown up by himself. Made many wrong decisions, (like many of us). He later got married and has two kids but when he started to get sick and was not able to work his wife left with the kids. She got married to someone else. We believe that God has already started the process of restoring everything in his life.

There are two kits available to choose from - and these can be adjusted to the needs of the community or individuals who are committing themselves to this project.



This is an initiative created by The Chicken Barn to assist families and communities in starting a viable farming endeavour. The challenges of the economy, the poor access to safe protein sources and the constant challenge of food security make this an ideal project to pursue.

The Process

- 4-week-old chicks are raised until 20 weeks.
- Chicks sleep and feed in the chicken coops, but roam outside in the daytime.
- A typical diet includes grass, insects, and commercial feeds.
- Chicken manure is removed daily and composted by piling up and watering.
- The coop is moved every six weeks, and manure is worked into the soil where the coop used to stand.
- Vegetable seeds are planted on the fertilized patch of soil.
- The ratio of chicks is usually 60% hens and 40% roosters.
- Two roosters are kept for breeding, and the rest are either slaughtered and sold or sold as live chickens.
- Roosters with good genetics can be sold for around 120 Rand** each.
- Profit from chicken sales is used to buy commercial feed.
 - **Note: Rand is the currency of South Africa and is subject to market prices and demand fluctuations.

The Chicken Barn Starter Kit

- 1 x 6 x 2m Chicken Coop built with PVC pipe and greenhouse sheeting.
- Nest boxes.
- Roosting Bars for chickens to sleep.
- Chicken Feeders and drinkers
- Commercial chicken feed*
- Vegetable seeds.
- Potchefstroom Koekoek Chicks 4-week old*
- Training and support
- Options to resupply your chicken enterprise affordably with additional feed, chickens etc to expand your operation if your so desire.

Do You Know Our

Passionate God?

The Passion of God Toward Us! God is all feeling, all heart. Ever had an emotional high? God has them. Yes, God's

emotions are stronger than ours, His feelings run deeper and more intense than ours. This is reflected in His judgements. No wonder *Romans 11:22 (NLT)* says; "Notice how God is both kind and severe. He is severe toward those who disobeyed, but kind to you if you continue to trust in his kindness. But if you stop trusting, you also will be cut off." We are talking of feelings leading to love for us, but we are also talking of feelings that lead to anger against injustice. If this sounds familiar, it is. Adam was made in the image of God. Your emotions are a reflection of God's emotions, so you have the ability to understand Him and relate to Him. Not that God is a respecter of persons though, for His sense of justice demands that all people be treated equally. But He does have His favourites...

He says in Isaiah 66:2 (NIV), "These are the ones I look on with favour: those who are humble and contrite in spirit, and who tremble at my word."

Jesus voiced this in the Beatitudes when He said in Matthew 5:3 (NLT, "God blesses those who are poor and realize their need for him, for the Kingdom of Heaven, is theirs." He was speaking of those who realised that their need of Him was so great that they understood what He stated in John 15:5 (NLT) when he said, "...apart from me you can do nothing." David was such a man.



The Passion of God Reflected in David's Passion For God

When the Sons of Jesse were called together that Samuel might anoint a king from among them, David was left out in the field, disregarded as a candidate. He could not rely on the compassion or appreciation of his family, he could only fall back on God's kindness. No wonder Acts 13:22 says that "I have found David son of Jesse, a man after my own heart. He will do everything I want him to do." Who else could he turn to but the Lord? It was the Lord that saw David's heart and had him anointed as king in front of all his more senior brethren.

Many claim to seek God through the Bible, but it's by the Bible only that they seek. God is far bigger than that. David saw the God of Israel work and speak in everything that was around him. He was seeing God deliver him from the lion and the bear and this was his preparation for tackling Goliath. While an army of people who knew the word of God remained paralysed on their feet.

He became "the sweet Psalmist of Israel" because his heart reflected the yearnings and emotions of the heart of God.



Reflecting on The Passion of Jesus reflects the Passion of His Father

In Psalm 23:5 (NLT) David declared; "You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies. You honour me by anointing my head with oil. My cup overflows with blessings." God honours the dishonoured, whose hope is in him. David was searching for and finding God in his everyday experiences. This was his "table of experiences" that he feasted on daily.

Jesus had these experiences during His walk here on earth. In Luke 10:21 (NLT) the scripture recounts that "At that same time Jesus was filled with the joy of the Holy Spirit, and he said, "O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, thank you for hiding these things from those who think themselves wise and clever, and for revealing them to the childlike. Yes, Father, it pleased you to do it this way." This prayer and the desire seen between Father and Son reveals to us that God roots for the lowly in heart. This is not an action taken by a hard, calculating speculator. It's more like the emotional, knee-jerk reaction of the world's "social justice warriors", only God does it on a far higher, more noble plane.

The need then, is for people to know this about the nature of God. In Jeremiah 9:23-24 (BSB) the prophet stated: "This is what the LORD says: 'Let not the wise man boast in his wisdom, nor the strong man in his strength, nor the wealthy man in his riches. But let him who boasts boast in this, that he understands and knows Me, that I am the LORD, who exercises loving devotion, justice and righteousness on the earth—for I delight in these things..." Knowing God in terms of His personality comes when we see what He likes and dislikes. It is the path to the heart of God.

John 17:3 (NLT) says; "And this is the way to have eternal life—to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, the one you sent to earth." Jesus is at the heart of God's passion! The Lord is far from being a cold, distant genius, our God is a person of emotions that run deep through the Bible and the pages of history. There are times in the Bible when it appears that God's emotions have threatened to overrule His logic. This is why 1 Corinthians 1:25 (NLT) says; "This foolish plan of God is wiser than the wisest of human plans, and God's weakness is stronger than the greatest of human strength."

In the Song of Solomon, 6:11-12 (TPT) The Shulamite Bride of the Prince (Christ) says, "I decided to go down to the valley streams where the orchards of the king grow and mature. I longed to know if hearts were opening. Are the budding vines blooming with new growth? Has their springtime of passionate love arrived? Then suddenly my longings transported me. My divine desire brought me next to my beloved prince, sitting with him in his royal chariot. We were lifted up together!" This means that when we see the beauty of the fruit and love of God's Spirit working through Jesus Christ, God imparts to us an experience, a "high" that far surpasses the greatest excitements that this world has to offer.

A godly Response to the Lord's Passion for Us

When people see how warm and loving God really is, their hearts can be turned to respond to God in thankfulness and wonder. Romans 2:4 (NIV) says that "...God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance... (turning)". It may be simple interest at the first, but as folk continue following Jesus in a relationship that is experiencing His kindness, this

curiosity turns to love. God is looking for dear companions to be with forever. From Adam and Eve, with whom He had fellowship during the cool of the day, to Jesus' twelve disciples, whom He chose firstly "to be with Him" on to the countless testimonies of vibrant Christians today. The Lord takes particular notice, however, of people who yearn and desire after Him.

Genesis 32:29 (NLT) is a prime example...We see the first account of Jacob taking an interest in God (instead of just in himself). It happened when Jacob "...asked the angel who had wrestled with him; 'Please tell me your name,' The angel replied; 'Why do you want to know my name?' Then he blessed Jacob there."

In 2 Samuel 7:17-29 (NLT) David was gifted with a gracious, passionate promise that far exceeded his passion as a human. He said, "I am living in a beautiful cedar palace, but the Ark of God is out there in a tent!" David was passionately concerned at the seeming injustice God was experiencing. God's reply to David was that he would instead build David a house in the form of an everlasting dynasty. We have read of the passion that God has for individuals, but

He also has passion for nations that desire to follow Him. In Jeremiah 2:2 (Amp) the Lord says to Israel: "I remember [earnestly] the lovingkindness and devotion of your youth, Your time of betrothal [like that of a bride during the early years in Egypt and again at Sinai], When you followed Me in the wilderness, Through a land not sown."

If this is what God did for saints before the New Testament time, how much more can He not do it for you today since Jesus walked the earth? God is looking for an excuse to bless you too!



God's Passion Builds Our Faith!

We can quote the scripture in Romans 10:17 (KJV) that says "...faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." And yet find that we still have no faith after we have read the Bible. We need to always understand that it is seeing the love of God in the Word of God that counts.

Galatians 5:6 (NLT) clearly says: "What is important is faith expressing itself in love..."

We can treat the Word of God as if it was some kind of mantra, which, if uttered, "magically" dispels any unbelief. Those doing this fail to see that if they do not <u>understand</u> the love and <u>sense</u> the feelings of God towards them, then their faith will not be quickened.

Allowing the Passion of God to Take You Further Many want a personal relationship with God, but don't believe that He has a personality. How can you have a relationship with someone like that? Many also feel that God is hard and uncaring because of what they have gone through with parents, siblings, teachers, fellow pupils, colleagues, family and even fellowships.

There are times that an uncaring element manifests itself in the Church. This has the potential to seriously distract many believers from early on in their Christian walk. But the Lord says in *Isaiah 49:15* (ESV); "Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you." Yet people's perceptions remain warped, and no wonder; it's hard to have warm conversation and fellowship with someone that you think is like a computer.

One of the effects of believing that God is a cold, emotionless being is that people struggle to talk to the Lord on a regular basis, if at all. Yet despite the bone-dry experience, many still persist in running their Christian experiences and their ministries in exactly this way. Matthew 7:23 (KJV) tells us that on Judgement Day, Jesus is going to say to many involved in ministry (but not in relating to Him)...

"I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity." it is iniquity (perverseness) to take hold of the good things of God without giving a moment's notice for the One who gave them to you. It is iniquity to see one's life taken from curse to blessing and yet have no feeling of love and gratefulness for the one who has been so kind to you.

God's Passion Can Show You A Better Way!

One does not need to have the heartless bone-dry religion that characterises the bulk of many religious institutions". God is a God of feeling for others and He wants to earnestly express his joy to you and allow you to live out the nature of Jesus in your own personal life. The experience begins with receiving His kindness towards you. Titus 3:4-5 (NLT) says: "When God our Saviour revealed his kindness and love, he saved us, not because of the righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy...." God "has done His loving", and now He is looking for a people that will respond to Him with the feelings He gave them. In Philippians 3:8-10 (Amplified Bible) the Apostle Paul outlines his response to this kindness, saying: "I count everything as loss compared to the priceless privilege and supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord...

...[and of growing more deeply and thoroughly acquainted with Him—a joy unequalled].For His sake, I have lost everything, and I consider it all garbage, so that I may gain Christ, and may be found in Him [believing and relying on Him], not having any righteousness of my own derived from [my obedience to] the Law and its rituals, but [possessing] that [genuine righteousness] which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith. And this, so that I may know Him [experientially, becoming more thoroughly acquainted with Him, understanding the remarkable wonders of His Person more completely]."

My encouragement to you is that you sit down and ponder over the Lord as being one who is all feeling and all compassion. Then reach out to Him on the basis of His promises to you, knowing that they are backed by an everlasting heart of love towards you.

There is a very old English saying - "you can't teach an old dog new tricks"

Society means that you cannot teach older people to change their ways and it can also mean older people are not able to adapt to "the new" as well as the younger generations can.

I have found this to be one of the worst lies of the enemy. A lie that many people have come in agreement with - and one they choose to live by.



The Biblical record of scripture shares with us far more examples of where God would use older folk to lead His people, to help His people and to rule His people.

There are very few scriptural examples of where youth are celebrated in a leadership capacity. King David was a younger man when he was anointed king, but his youthful passion would cost him a child and the life of a dedicated soldier.

We celebrate the raising of the Joshua generations (the next generation) - but we do it at the expense of forgetting those who the world now calls "old dogs".

Why does the world hate the older generation? Is it because they seem weak? Does it remind men and women of what we all need to face - the reality of ageing and death?

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Can You Teach an Old Dog?






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
